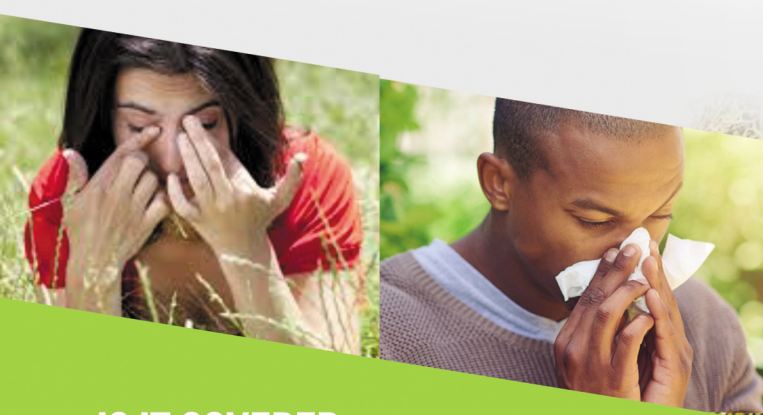

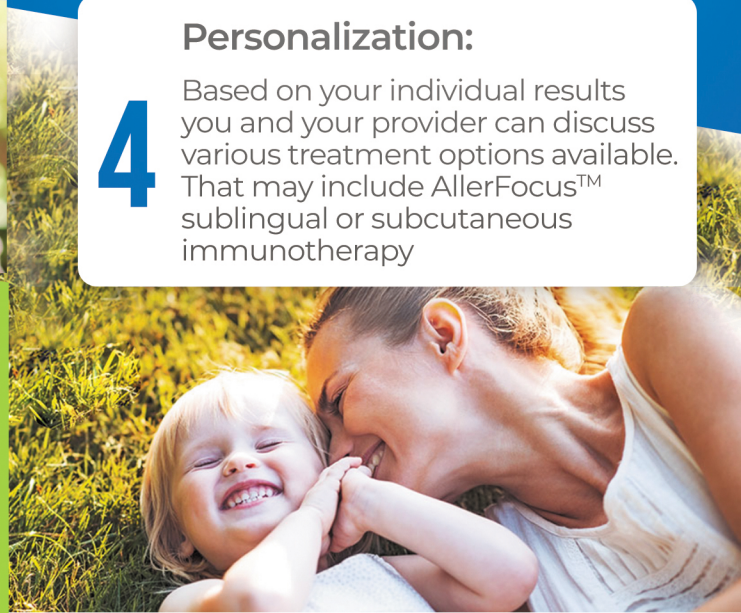
HOW DOES ALLERFOCUS™ WORK?

1 Testing:

What Happens if you Receive a Positive Result?

AllerFocus™ offers treatment plans that may or may not include shots. Most patients significantly improve their symptoms simply taking their Allergy Immunotherapy.

Why Immunotherapy?

Allergy Immunotherapy is the only treatment that targets the cause of allergies and alters the natural course of the disease. With immunotherapy patients may have an improved quality of life, see an end to discomfort, feeling ill, and have lower costs for symptomatic drugs.

What is Immunotherapy?

Allergies are caused by your immune system overreacting towards harmless substances the same way it would react towards something harmful like bacteria or a virus. Allergy immunotherapy, used worldwide, slowly “trains” your immune system so you may tolerate these substances upon exposure.

How does Immunotherapy Work?

Immunotherapy occurs in two distinct phases: build-up and maintenance. The build-up process begins with the administration of a weak concentration of an allergy extract which becomes increasingly stronger until you reach the maximum dose. After reaching the maximum dose you enter the “maintenance” phase.

Immunotherapy is recommended for 3 - 5 years, however, length of treatment is determined by your provider.
